

ALUMNI PROFILE

Brett Douglas '88 Applies Signal Processing Theory to Stock Selection

Alum Tells of His Experience in Sigma Phi Delta and How It Impacted His Career

After graduating in 1988, **Brett Douglas** joined the Imaging Systems Research Group at the University of Illinois. Sonatech sponsored his Ph.D work developing a synthetic aperture imaging sonar that was deployed on the USS Dolphin, then the world's deepest diving submarine. Brett joined Sonatech after graduate school and led the development of an obstacle avoidance sonar for the US Navy SEALS' Mark 8 submarines.

Brett left the sonar industry in 1996 to participate in Silicon Valley's telecommunications ad networking boom. He developed signal interception technology for two years, then joined Cisco's Wireless Access Business Unit. His first project, a precursor to WIMAX, was ready for market just as the tech bubble burst, so he switched his focus to 802.11 wireless networks. He managed the digital processing team that developed 802.11a/b/g chips for Cisco's access points. He developed the radio planning and location algorithms for Cisco's Wireless LAN Solution Engine, a product that made it easy for customers to deploy, monitor, and secure wireless networks with over 1000 access points. From 2003 through 2007, Brett led Cisco's standards and development effort for 802.11N technology, which improved the speed of wireless networks from 54 Mbps to 300 Mbps.

Brett's investment management career started as an experiment in 1996. He read several books describing stock selection methods that had outperformed the stock market indices. Brett spent his weekends crunching data looking for fundamental and technical factors that were correlated with stock returns. He then used those factors to predict future stock performance. By October 2006, his stock predictor was using 25 different factors, he was managing seven accounts, and he had documented an

eight-year track record of outperforming the Russell 3000 index. He took a leave of absence from Cisco Systems to start Douglas Capital Management, LLC. He focuses his investments in small cap, micro cap, and foreign stocks where the markets are least efficient, and therefore provide the most opportunity for superior performance. His firm now has over 100 clients, including several Sigma Phi Delta alums. He is very grateful for the confidence they have placed in him to manage a portion of their investments.

Brett's experience at Sigma Phi Delta has benefited him in many ways. He made many good friends at Sigma Phi Delta, and he still keeps in contact with many of them. He met his first wife at a Sigma Phi Delta party. They were happily married for 13 years before she died. There were many excellent role models at Sigma Phi Delta who went on to achieve academic and career success. The most valuable experience came from the chapter meetings themselves, where actives had to develop the skill to quickly and clearly make a persuasive point to influence the decisions of the chapter.
