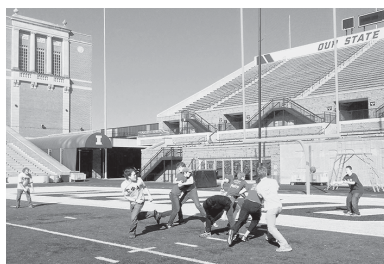


HOMECOMING

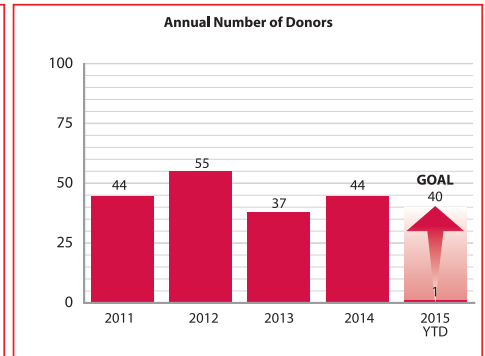
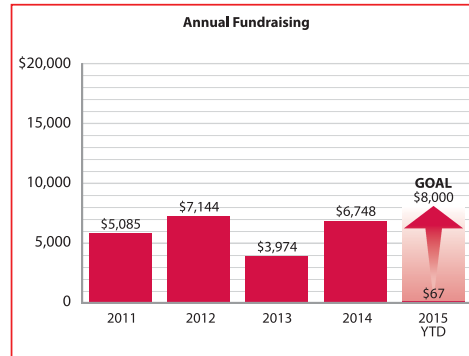
The Future of SPD Relies On You

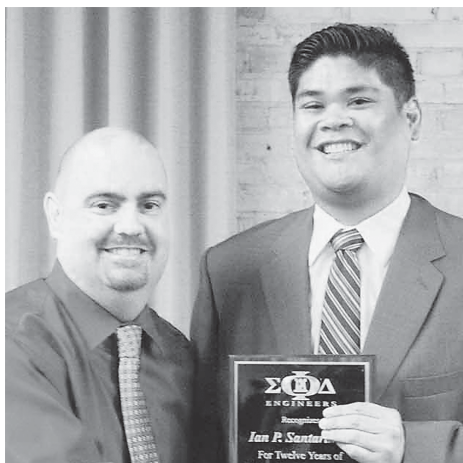
